Guajome Park Academy Graduation Requirements

○ Social Studies	40 credits
○ English	40 credits
○ Math	30 credits
○ Science (Life & Physical)	30 credits
○ Foreign Language	30 credits
○ Visual/Performing Art	10 credits
○ College Prep Elective	10 credits
○ PE	20 credits
○ Electives	20 credits
Total	230 credits



10 credits = 1 year





CAHSEE

California High School Exit Exam

- This test covers **English Language Arts** and **Mathematics**
 - Math covers skills through Algebra 1
- Students will have several opportunities to pass the exam during their high school career.
 - First attempt: spring of **10th grade** year.
 - Two chances **11th grade** and three chances **12th grade**.
 - Once a portion is passed, the student does not need to take it again.
- For those students who do not pass either section of the exam they will be provided with additional assistance (i.e. CAHSEE classes, online test preparation, etc)



Other GPA Requirements

- Community Service – 30 hrs/year
- Personal Project (10th grade)
- Senior Project (12th grade)
- Senior Defense (12th grade)
- Minimum 2.0 grade point average

University Requirements “A-G”



11 of the 15 requirements must be done by end of 11th grade

(a) History	2 years -World History -American History / U.S. Government
(b) English	4 years college prep
(c) Mathematics	3 years required (4 recommended) -Minimum: Algebra 2
(d) Science	2 years with lab (Biology, Chemistry, Physics) [3 recommended]
(e) Foreign Language	2 years same language (3 recommended)
(f) Visual / Performing Arts	1 year
(g) Elective	1 year

- 40 credits/sem

Summer School

- Students must attend summer school to make up a “D” or “F” they earned during the year. Only certain classes are offered during summer school, and if you fail a class that is not offered, you may have to retake it during the school year.
 - Students who do not make up “F’s” right away jeopardize graduating on time and earning a high school diploma.



What is my Grade Point Average?

- Each letter grade is worth a certain point value

A = 4 points

B = 3 points

C = 2 points

D = 1 point

F = 0 points

(HONORS/IB/AP COURSES GET AN ADDITIONAL POINT for A, B, C)

- Count how many A's, B's, C's, D's and F's you have and then add them up. Once you've added then divide by the number of classes you are taking.

Example: 2 - A's, 3 - B's, 2- C's and 1- D **$4+4+3+3+3+2+2+1 = 22$ Points**

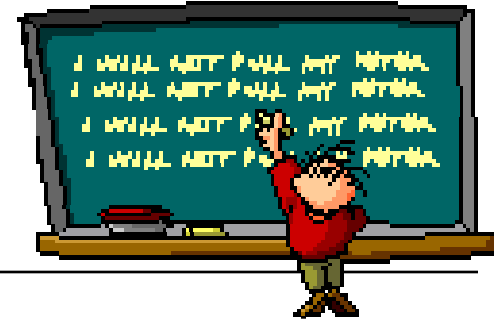
$22 / 8$ Classes = 2.75 GPA

Extracurricular Activities/Eligibility

- Athletes must have:
 - At least a **2.0 GPA** (athletes are held responsible for maintaining a 2.0 each grading period)
 - All players must have a clearance slip turned into their coach prior to the first practice

Discipline Record



- **Best to avoid—think before you act!!!**
- Refer to GPA rules and expectations.
- Most students graduate without a discipline issue.
- Colleges are now asking about discipline records.

How can my counselor help me?

- **Academic Counseling**
 - Planning for the future: 4 year plan
 - Organizational, study and test-taking skills, & goal setting
- **Personal Counseling**
 - Communication, problem-solving, decision-making, and conflict resolution
 - Peer relationships and effective social skills
- **College and Career Counseling**
 - Planning for careers and education beyond high school
 - Develop future plans for career
- **Referrals to Community Resources**

- Most importantly, to help you **succeed!**

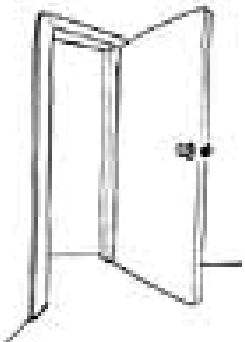
Keys to Success

- Attendance
- Start with the end in mind
- Make sure to set aside time for studying
- Be prepared for class exams and projects
- Break assignment apart into manageable pieces
- Communication with teachers, counselors, and family....Always ask questions if unsure!!!
- Keeping track of grades (Weekly progress report forms)
- **DO NOT WAIT UNTIL THE LAST MINUTE**



Remember!!!

- **Start thinking about your future **NOW****
- **As a high school student, all classes and **all grades COUNT!****
- **Most **four-year colleges** look at **10th** and **11th** Grade grades and classes taken for admissions purposes**
- **Keep in mind: if you are credit deficient and/or have a low grade point average, you may need to attend an alternative educational program for graduation**

 - Visit the Guidance Department and Guidance Page often to sign up (as new visits will be scheduled on a daily basis)
- **North County College Fair @ Carlsbad HS, Wednesday, October 7, 2009 5-7pm**
- **PSAT Wednesday, October 14, 2009 \$15** (sign up in the Counseling Office)—not required, HIGHLY recommended...space is limited (and always sells out), so don't wait!
- **ASVAB: November 3, 2009**
 - Military Entrance requirement (but do not need to release scores to military if you do not want to)
 - Free Career Interest Inventory for grades 10-12, permission slip required
- **Palomar and Mira Costa College Concurrent Enrollment** (earn high school and college credit)...see your counselor for the forms
 - Palomar: 8th grade, Mira Costa: 10th grade
 - Free Tuition at Palomar
