

MAIN CAMPUS GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

GPA strives to offer high school students an educational program which is flexible, demanding, and appropriate. The course of study at high school shall require all students to successfully complete the following requirements for graduation from our Main Campus program:

Main Campus Credit/Subject Requirements (230 credits total)

Social Studies	40 credits
English	40 credits
Math (minimum Algebra 2)	30 credits
Science (Life & Physical)	30 credits
Foreign Language	30 credits
Visual/Performing Art	10 credits
College Prep Elective	10 credits
PE	20 credits
Electives	20 credits

Additional Main Campus Graduation Requirements

In addition to the credit/subject requirements, Main Campus students are also expected to fulfill the following in order to receive their diploma:

- California High School Exit Exam (CAHSEE)
- Community Service – 30 hours per year
- Personal Project (10th grade)
- Senior Project (12th grade)
- Senior Defense (12th grade)
- Minimum 2.0 cumulative grade point average

Special Education and Other Special Circumstances

Identified Special Education students may take an alternative course of study as specified in their IEP to achieve the unit requirements for graduation with a certificate of completion. This certificate is awarded in lieu of the traditional high school diploma.

In cases of documented hardship the Charter School Superintendent or his/her Designee may waive any specific requirement, except for requirements mandated by the State of California, after consultation with the specific subject area staff/leader and/or Instructional Team/Graduation Council.
